St. Henry High School will be administering the Ohio State Tests starting on Tuesday, April 8<sup>th</sup>. The Ohio State Tests are planned to be administered as follows:

- English 10 on April 8<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> in the Morning
- Algebra I and Geometry on April 29<sup>th</sup> and May 1<sup>st</sup> in the Afternoon
- American Government, American History and Biology on April 30<sup>th</sup> in the Morning

A more detailed schedule will be passed out to the students in late March/early April. All students not involved with testing will be expected to attend school during regular school hours, 8:05-2:58. The tractor was raffled off on the last day of the Mercer County Fair. Over 700 raffle tickets were sold. Thank you so much to everyone who bought a raffle ticket in support of the FFA chapter. In addition, as the fall fruit and nut sales concluded, members would like to thank everyone who purchased something from the St. Henry FFA.

As the days become colder, the time commitment becomes longer for several FFA members. From studying and participating in Career Development Events, attending conventions and meetings, and doing community service activities, St. Henry FFA members have been busy. In October, three students competed in the district Job Interview contest, with one student advancing to the state contest. In December, four students competed in the Agricultural Technology & Mechanical Systems contest, where they placed 7th in the state. In addition, seven students recently competed in the district Food Science contest, where they placed 6th. Upcoming contests that students are preparing for include Ag Biotechnology, Public

Speaking, Nursery & Landscaping, Outdoor Power, and Ag Power Diagnostics.

In November, the St. Henry FFA traveled to Indianapolis with the Coldwater FFA for the 97th National FFA Convention. On their trip, students had the opportunity to tour several agricultural businesses in Ohio and Indiana. Students toured MVP Dairy in Celina, Ohio, where they learned and saw how over 4,000 cows were milked, fed, and cared for daily. In addition, students met with representatives from Tyson Fresh Meats in Logansport, Indiana, where students got the chance to see and learn how over 16,000 hogs were processed daily. In addition, students toured Beck's Hybrids in Atlanta, Indiana, where students had the chance to see and learn about the largest familyowned retail seed company. At the convention, students interacted with nearly 70,000 other FFA members from around the country, listened to guest speakers and National FFA Officers, visited with hundreds of agricultural colleges and businesses, went to a rodeo, and went to Kelsay Farms for the annual Buckeye Bash, an outdoor venue for Ohio FFA students. Thank you to everyone who helped make this trip possible.

Once again, the St. Henry FFA delivered over 50 meals to local farmers during harvest time to thank them for their time, dedication and support of agriculture. In addition, as a Capstone project, three students from the FFA chapter recently remodeled a local community member's shed, where they replaced the roof, doors, and siding. During the holiday season, the first grade class visited the ag shop, where they made personalized snowmen out of wood. A high school student was paired up with the first grader to help measure, cut, sand, and paint the snowmen. While the paint dried, students of all ages enjoyed coloring Christmas pictures, drinking hot chocolate, eating candy canes and marshmallows, and listening to Christmas music. After the paint dried, the first graders gave their snowmen eyes, a nose, mouth, scarf, and a hat.

Finally, the St. Henry Agricultural Education Advisory Committee has been working on creating a St. Henry FFA Ag Boosters organization, a group dedicated to supporting students involved in the St. Henry FFA program.
