Renewal Operating Levy Passed

On Tuesday, March 19th, 2024, the voters within the St. Henry Consolidated Local School District passed our renewal operating levy that will collect \$1,010,000 annually for the next five years. This levy was initially approved back in 2014 and will be set to expire on December 31st,

2028. The money collected from the levy will continue to fund basic programs and services such as teacher salaries, support staff salaries, instructional supplies and curriculum, utilities, building and equipment maintenance, extracurricular activities, and transportation costs. With the continued support of the community, we will continue to work hard to meet the needs of our students and prepare them with the skills and knowledge necessary to be successful and productive citizens.


